### 1. What is the Purpose of Offering HMTL?

Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) has been officially offered at P5 and P6 since 1992 for students who showed strong proficiency and interest in Mother Tongue Language (MTL).

To further strengthen the learning of MTL from an early age, primary schools will offer HMTL across the 3 official MTLs from P3 onwards.

### P3 Higher Mother Tongue Language

It is designed to enthuse P3 students who demonstrate the ability and interest to develop higher levels of MT language proficiency and cultural knowledge.

### 2. Selection Guidelines

#### For P3 entry:

- We will use a set of qualitative descriptors (QDs) based on the P2 Mother Tongue Languages Learning Outcomes to determine students' MTL proficiency.
- Students offering HMTL at P3 and subsequently, at P4 should <u>be proficient</u> in their oracy skills and <u>demonstrate strong foundation for literary skills</u>.

#### **Criteria:**

- Evidence of students' performance throughout the year;
- Teachers' feedback and observations

For P4 entry, we will take a similar approach, in addition to P3 Weighted Assessments and End of Year exam results.

### 3. Key Features of P3 & P4 HMTL Curriculum

### **Built on existing MTL curriculum:**

<u>Literary-based text</u>

To provide students with an enjoyable early experience to ethnic literature.

- Exposure to higher-order thinking exercises
  - To enhance students' reasoning skills and construction of new knowledge
- Creative and fun-filled activities and games to teach language and cultural knowledge

To sustain students' interest and extend their knowledge.



### 4. P3 HMTL @Chongzheng Primary School

- Two additional periods per week outside curriculum time;
- Use of textbook and literature-based text.

### 5. Assessment

- No weighted assessment (Scores do not form part of overall results computation)
- Child's progress will be indicated in HMTL in the Holistic Development Profile.

# 6. Benefits of taking HMTL from P3 and other related issues

Offering of HMTL will encourage your child with strong interest and aptitude in Mother Tongue Languages to start early and learn MTL to as high a level as he/she can.

# Common Questions by parents

# Can my child still offer HMTL at upper primary levels even if he/she did not offer it at P3 and P4 level?

- Your child could still offer HMTL at P5 and P6 level when he/she builds stronger proficiency and interest.
- The offering of HMTL from P3-P5 is a parental option whereas the offering of HMTL at P6 is a school-based decision.
- You are strongly encouraged to discuss with the school which course best suits the learning need of your child.

# If my child decides to discontinue with HMTL during P3 or P4, will he/she be allowed to drop out?

- To truly benefit from the HMTL curriculum at P3, he/she should offer HMTL for at least two years to ascertain his/her ability to cope with it.
- If the child really finds difficulty coping, he/she can drop HMTL in consultation with the school.

### What are the key features?


- Smaller class size

- Taught by trained MTSP teachers




















# **Examples of Learning Resources (Malay)**

| Encourage your child to learn MTL  | Making comparison between your child and other children's achievement |
| <ul> <li>Praise your child for his/her good effort and progress</li> </ul>     |   |
| Set incremental and achievable goals with your child                           |   |
| Communicate with the school teacher regularly on your child's progress at home |   |

### Practical tips to help your child learn MTL

- Speak to your child in MTL whenever possible
- Show interest in your child's MTL learning
- · Learn with your child, learn from your child
- Have regular conversations with your child about his/her experience in class
- Use a variety of resources, e.g. physical and digital resources to extend your child's language and literacy skills in MTL
- Encourage and accompany your child to read books or watch suitable TV programmes in MTL
- Provide a print-rich environment visit the library regularly, set up a reading corner at home
